- Team of the Year -- Business Objects' on-demand team that delivered a new Web 2.0 software-as-a-service offering, crystalreports.com, from concept to 37,000 subscribers in 12 months.
- Most Promising Pre-Commercial Technology -- Nutri-Loc, a company that uses a state-of-the-art technology to preserve the flavour, freshness and nutritional value of fruits and vegetables without using chemicals or preservatives.
- Excellence in Product Innovation -- Top Producer for its "market snapshot", a tool that allows realtors to offer customers real-time Multiple Listing Service market updates and trend analysis.
- Best Application of Technology -- In Motion Technology for providing mobile wireless communications for police and emergency workers that can shift between wireless networks to find the strongest connection.
- Most Promising Start-up -- Mobidia, a company that is tackling one of the toughest problems for wireless carriers: Delivering high-value multi-media mobile content to consumer devices.
- Emerging Company of the Year -- Digital Payment Technologies, a company that has brought digital payment technology to parking.
